Each year, twelve undergraduate students from the College of Humanities are selected to live in the O.C. Tanner Humanities House in historic Fort Douglas. Originally built in the 1870's as officers' quarters, the house has been renovated to create a unique living and learning community for students. Residents receive \$1,200 annual scholarship from the College of Humanities.

Requirements for living in the Humanities House:

Declared Major in the College of Humanities: You must be a declared major in the College of Humanities at the time of application (Asian Studies, Communication, English, History, International Studies, Languages & Literature, Latin American Studies, Linguistics, Middle East Studies, Peace & Conflict Studies, Philosophy, Religious Studies, Writing & Rhetoric Studies).

GPA & Residency Requirement: You must maintain a cumulative 3.0 GPA and have 24 credit hours at the University of Utah. You may seek special consideration for housing if you believe the traditional academic measures do not represent your potential for academic success. To seek exception, please address this discrepancy by answering the additional question in the essay.

Every Week:

<u>Weekly House Event</u>: Each resident must organize one event per semester. Options include: group dinner, movie night, game night, BE CREATIVE!

<u>Cleaning Procedures</u>: You are required to clean up after yourself at all times. Rotate cleaning duties including dishes, cleaning common areas, and taking out garbage.

Officers Circle Recycling: Recycled items are collected from each house in Officers Circle and taken to recycling bins.

SEMESTER Events:

Faculty Fireside Teas: Each month the Humanities House invites faculty from the majors represented in the House to discuss their research, related events and personal path to their professions. Residents must attend each Fireside Tea.

In addition, Humanities House residents may select cultural/educational events throughout the semester to attend as a group. When possible, the College of Humanities will invite faculty experts in the area to the house for a discussion of the event. Residents are expected to attend all events.

Annual Events:

Each resident is required to select ONE College event per year to assist in the planning, publicity, and help at the event. Residents work closely with the Dean's Office staff in assisting with College events. 2015-2016 events TBA Spring 2015.
